

## Photo Journal: NO THRUSH® use on Wounds and Proud Flesh



### Boo – Day 1 (Late Spring)

Boo suffered a deep gash to his leg, which manifested into severe proud flesh.

**PROTOCOL/USAGE:** The proud flesh is dusted with NO THRUSH® once daily (can be used more often if desired). Below (day 2-3) the wound is still oozing. However, NO THRUSH® is absorbing the drainage as desired, and protecting the wound from bacterial infection, which is always a secondary concern with any open wound.

By day 4 (photographed *before* the day's dusting) NO THRUSH® has already staunched the drainage near the edges of the wound. It is now breaking the proud flesh cycle by eliminating the excess drainage, and by shrinking the capillaries within the abnormal tissue. This blood flow would otherwise continue to feed and encourage the proud flesh. Over the next week NO THRUSH will absorb, dry, and then harden the abnormal tissue. Thereafter the tissue will begin to naturally fall away, allowing healthy regrowth of the surrounding skin and coat.

NOTE: After 7 days Boo was sent back out to pasture and dusted every few days with NO THRUSH®. No additional steps were taken, (no washing, no picking of scabs, and no restriction of leg movement)

Here on Day 60 the scarring from the original leg wound is visible, (if you look really hard), however there is no proud flesh scarring whatsoever. This use of NO THRUSH® has eliminated the need for costly vet debridement.
